- His music career began there in 1954, when he started to work with the owner of Sun Records.
- Presley's first RCA single, "Heartbreak Hotel", was a numberone hit in the US.



In 1968, following a seven-year break from live performances, Elvis led to extended concerts and a string of highly profitable tours.

Several years of prescription drug abuse deteriorated his health, and he died in 1977 at the age of 42.
