

## Deciduous trees

All the leaves of these species fall usually when comes the fall of each year, Coinciding with the arrival o cold weather and the shorter duration of the light of the day.

The wind and rain contribute to the fall.

Most of them live in the forest of
the atlantic climate, they lose the leaves
when environmental
conditions are harsh.





## Evergreen trees

Copies of this type renew their leaves slowly, over several years, within a continuous process in which the new leaves grow before the old ones fall. Every day they lose a small percentage of the total number. Within the tropical regions, most of the trees in this type

belong to the subclass of conifers.

Some can keep without much change for very long periods, even 17 years.



## **BONSAI TREES**

Bonsay trees are often thought to have originated from Japan, but records over 2,000 years ago show that trees begin to be grown in China. Around 1,500 years ago trees, many of which would have been collected from mountainous regions, were first grown as individual specimens and these can be seen crearly on ancient Chinese line drawings.

Several centuries later, the Japanese began growing trees in pots. Nowadays, it is a hobby.
