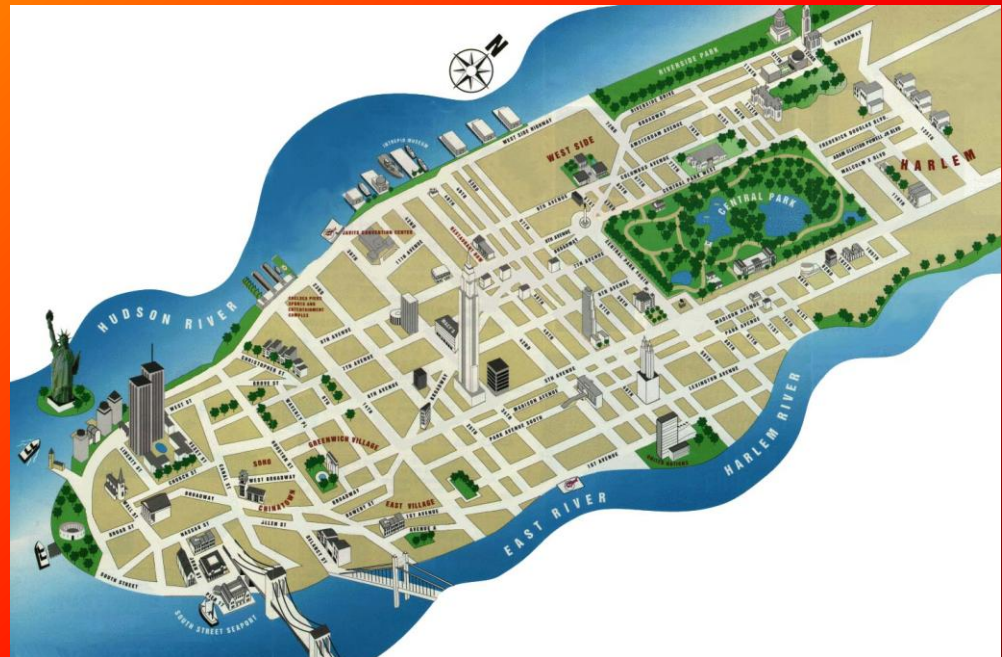

- Queens



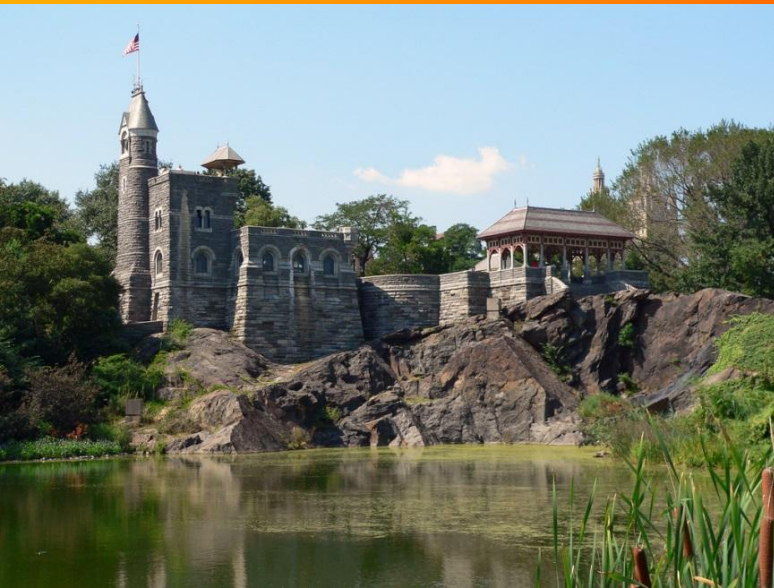
# Monuments

- Central Park: It's the most famous in the world. It's opened since 1857.



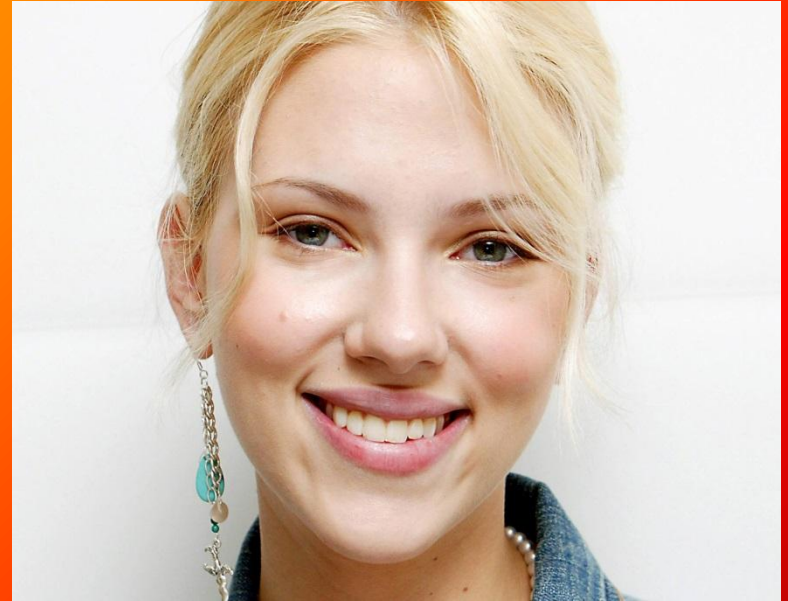

# Festivals

- New York film festival :
  - The creator of this festival was Richard Peña Era.
  - The first edition was held in 1962 in Boston , but now the celebration is in New York.
  - Last year it was the 50-year anniversary.





- The Marathon of New York:
  - It is celebrated on the first Sunday of November.
  - Distance : 42.195km.
  - The records:
    - The men record: 2h 31m 38 s (Gary Muhrcke)
    - The woman record: 2h 32m (Grete Waitz)



- Independence day:
  - The Independence Day is celebrated on 4<sup>th</sup> of July.
  - It commemorates the declaration of the independence from Great Britain. This was the origin of the American Nation.
  - In New York, on the night of 4<sup>th</sup> of July, the Macy's department store organizes a show with fireworks.
