- When the Second World War finished, the Canadians have supported multilateralism abroad and socioeconomic development domestically.
- Canada consist of ten provinces and three territories and is governed as a parliamentary democracy and a constitutional monarchy with Queen Elizabeth II.

Geographic Characteristics

Canada's coast is very irregular, with big bays and peninsulas.

There are 31 lakes that take up an area of more than 1.300 square kilometers.

The Robson Mountain is the highest one, with 3.954 meters.

There are more mountain ranges, such as mountain Logan, San Elias, McKinley...


