- *In a corner of the Atlantic Ocean, where its waters swaying in the Caribbean Sea, the Bahamas are an archipelago of more than two thousand six hundred islands and rocks that host a paradise of coral and marine life . A delight for divers to explore its corners with the advantage of exploring the sea botton barely submerged 30 meters deep.*

The Bahamas

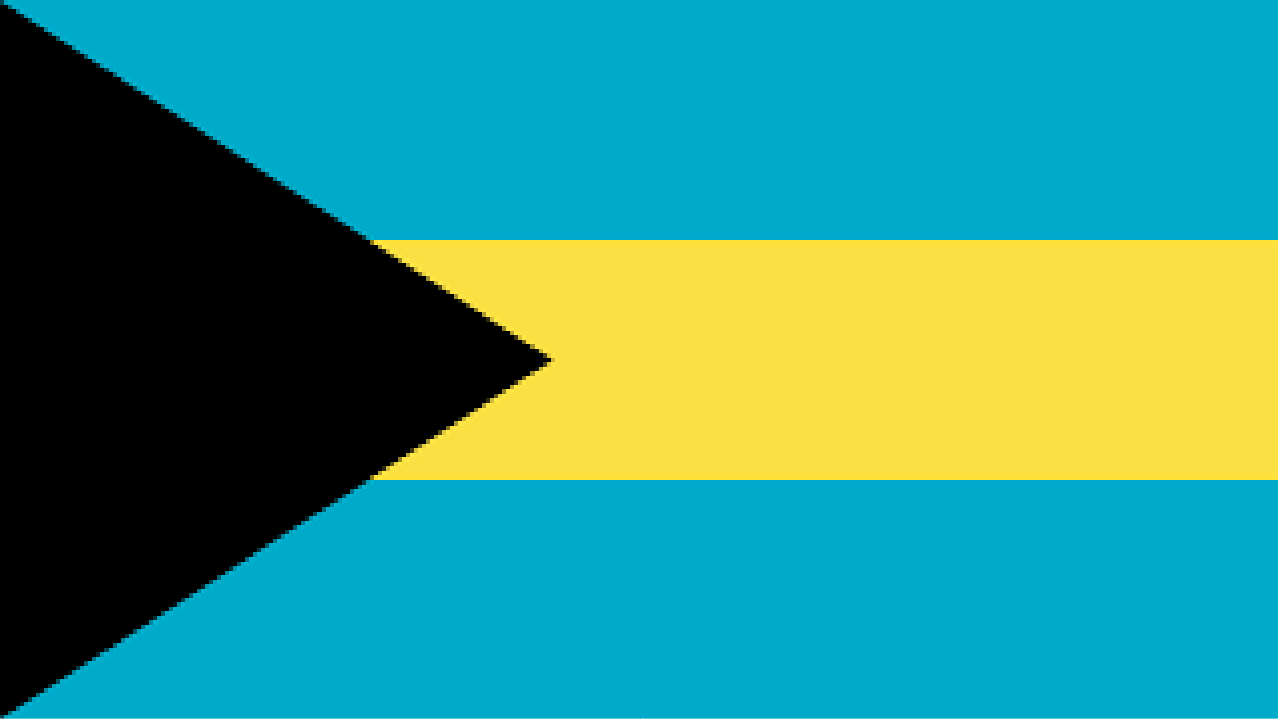

- *The Bahamas are controlled south by Cuba, Florida and west to southwest by the Turks. Fueled by the magnetism of the Bermuda Triangle, its rocks served as a refuge for pirates and bandits of Tropic of Cancer Seas, including forged his own legend the pirate Blackbeard.*
- *As for the vegetation, the north of the archipelago is dominated by Caribbean pine, and South populate the bushes, among which are found 120 species of plants that only live in the Bahamas, and over 50 types of orchids. In its waters, incredible coral reefs are home to hawksbill turtles, dolphins, sharks and seahorses.*

The Bahamas

- *Nassau is the capital city of the island and has 70 percent of the entire population. There are 248,000 inhabitants in Nassau.*
- *Nassau was formerly known as Charles Town; it was discovered by the Spanish in 1684.*
- *The city's proximity to the United States has contributed to its popularity as a holiday resort. The Atlantis resort on nearby Paradise Island accounts for more tourist arrivals to the city than any other hotel property. The mega-resort employs over 6,000 Bahamians, and is the largest employer outside government.*

The Seychelles

- *Seychelles, (officially the Republic of Seychelles) is a group of 115 islands located in the Indian Ocean northeast of Madagascar,.*
- *Its capital is Victoria, the only city in the archipelago, located on Mahe Island. It has the only international airport and port of the country.*
