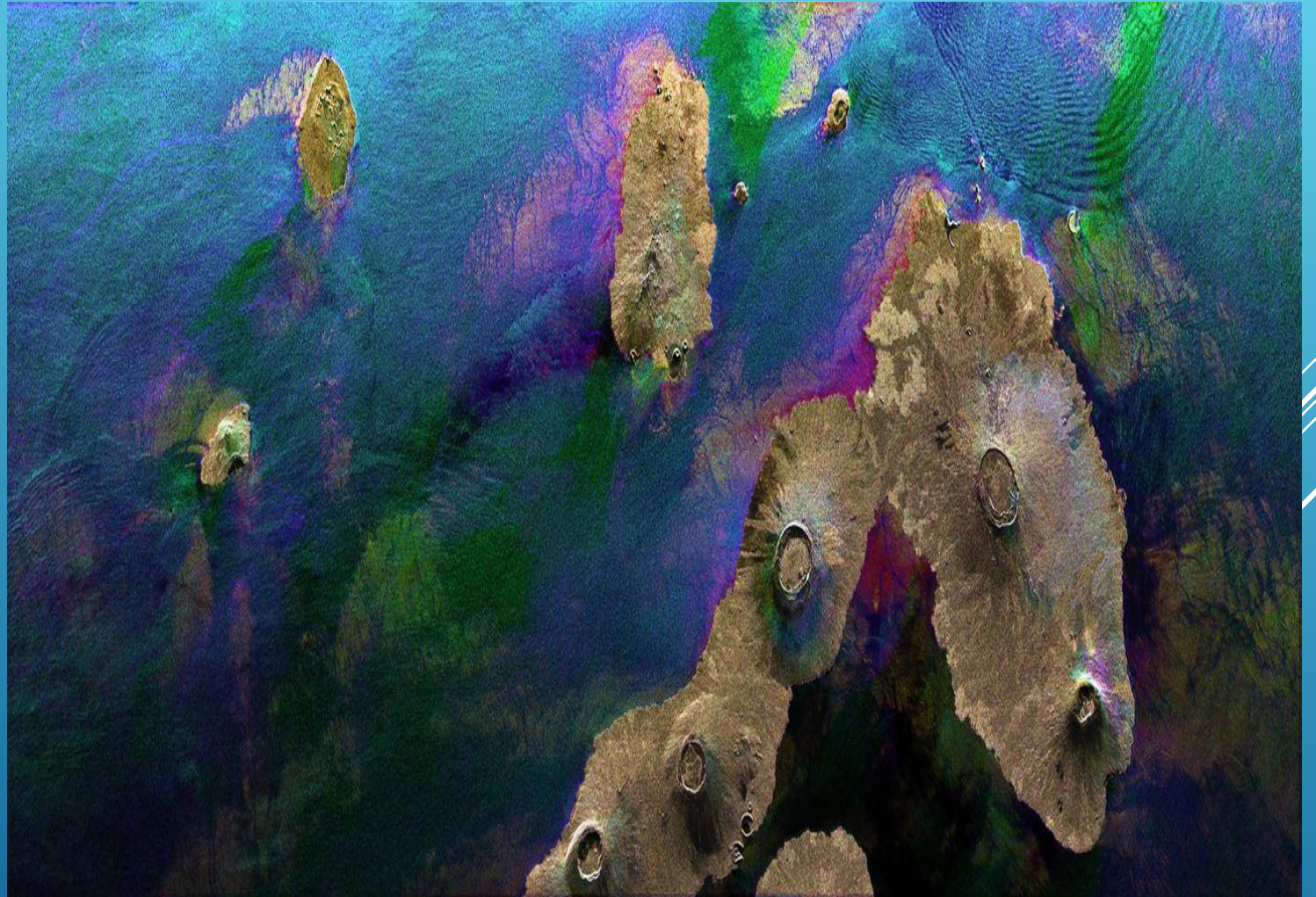

Earth.



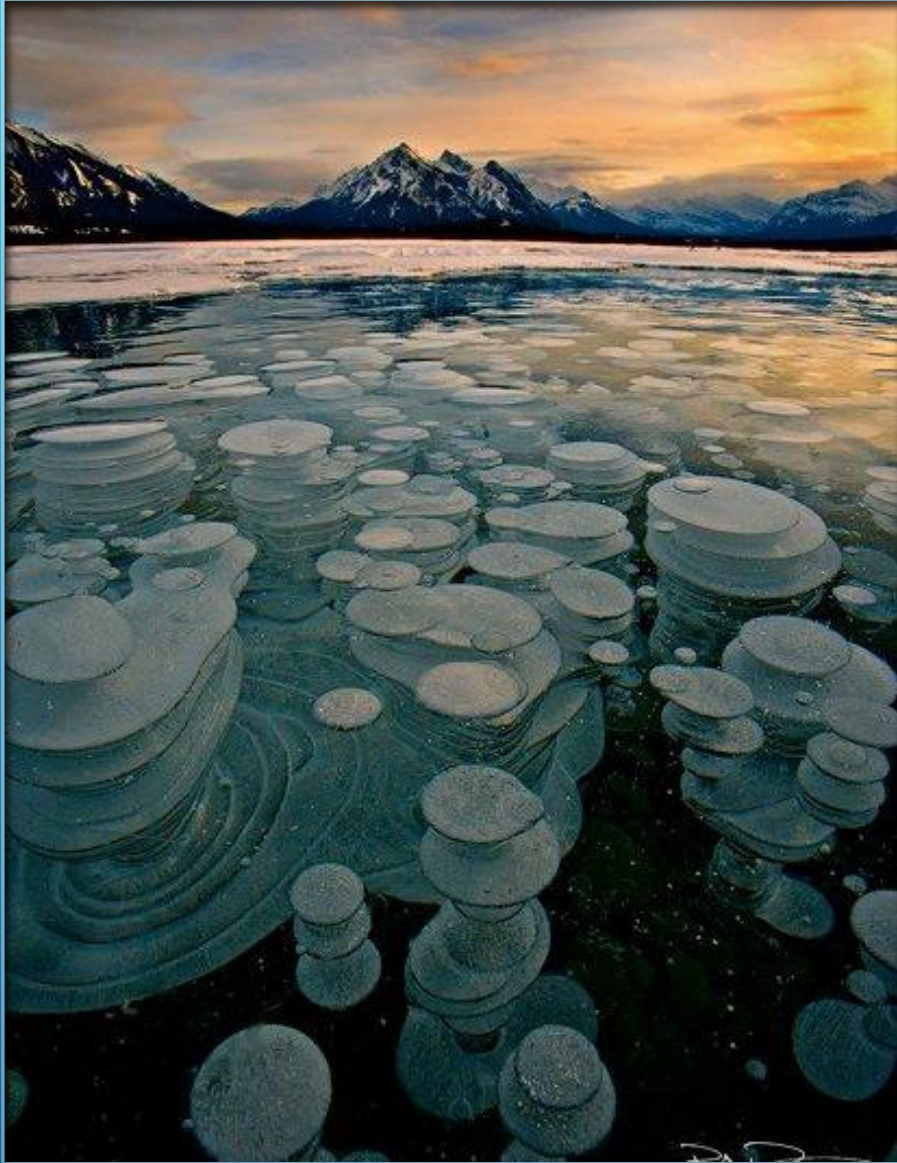


# GREEN LAKE

# LAKE NATRON



Lake Natron is a salt and soda lake in the Arusha Region of northern Tanzania.

The colour of the lake is red. Most animals find the lake's high temperature up to  $60^{\circ}\text{C}$  and its high and variable salt content inhospitable.

The crab is a specie of land crab that is endemic to Christmas Island. Red crabs are solitary animals and will defend their burrows from intruders.

The eggs released by the females immediately hatch upon contact with sea water near the shore until they are swept out to sea for 3-4 weeks.

Dean could run at around 7-10 km/ph until he died of old age.

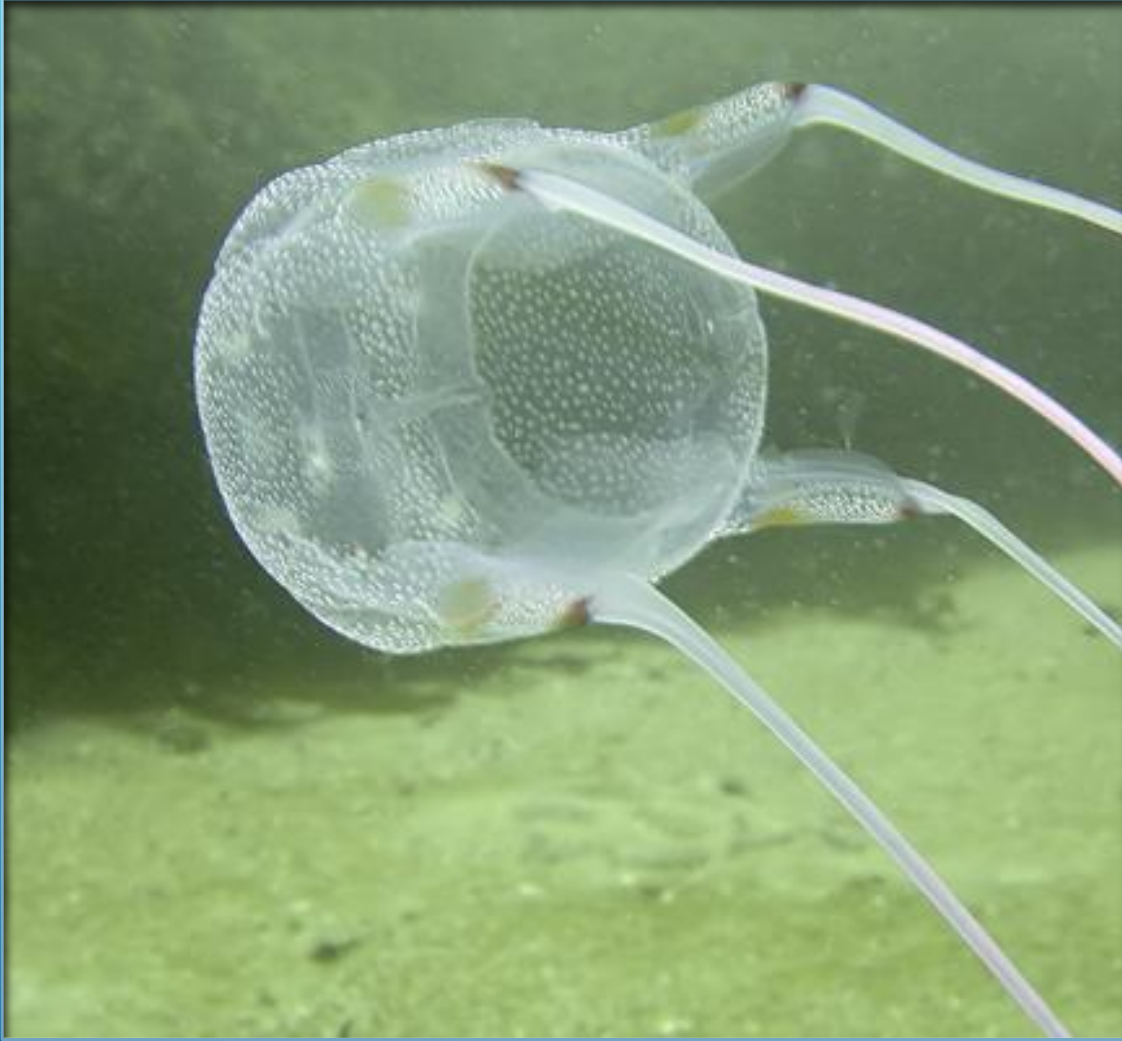


## THE ICE MAN
